9 THE COURT: Good morning, Mr. Johnson. Are you Mr.
10 Fox?
11 THE ACCUSED: I'm Mr. Fox, yes.
12 THE COURT: What are we doing, Mr. Johnson?
13 CNSL C. JOHNSON: Your Honour, I'm the Crown on this
14 file and it was put over to today's date for Mr.
15 Fox to advise whether he wanted to seek bail,
16 whether he was going to get a lawyer or not.
17 THE COURT: What do you want to do, Mr. Fox?
18 THE ACCUSED: Well, I'm still waiting for evidence to
19 come to prove that Mr. Johnson's submissions at
20 the previous hearing are all either completely
21 false or grossly misrepresented. So, I would like
22 an adjournment.
23 THE COURT: All right. How long is it going to take
24 you to get a lawyer?
25 THE ACCUSED: No, I'm not trying to get a lawyer. I'm
26 going to represent myself. I'm waiting for
27 evidence to come to prove that he's full of crap.
28 THE COURT: I'm sorry, but what kind of evidence are
29 you waiting for? A transcript?
30 THE ACCUSED: No, no, no. Some of these submissions
31 that he made at the first bail hearing last week
32 are grossly inaccurate and so I'm just waiting for
33 documentary evidence [indiscernible] to prove that
34 everything he said is completely wrong.
35 THE COURT: All right. And how long is it going to
36 take you to get that?
37 THE ACCUSED: I don't know. Anywhere from, like, a
38 week to three months. Who knows.
39 THE COURT: Well, why don't we try a week? Mr. --
40 THE ACCUSED: Sure.
41 THE COURT: -- Johnson, are you available October 1st?
42 CNSL C. JOHNSON: One moment, Your Honour. I will say
43 while I'm checking my calendar that I did make
44 some submissions before JJP Rogers last week, but
45 it wasn't in the context of a bail hearing, and so
46 needless to say I stand by what I said, but the
47 fact is it's irrelevant at this stage --
