- 4 D Uh, it's just the interview room. It's been modified, but, uh, if you don't mind
- grabbin' a seat on the other side there. Thanks. Um, yeah, they modified this
- room for interviews due to the ongoing global, uh, pandemic of COVID-
- 7 F Sure.
- 8 D ...19. Uh, this room has been sanitized.
- 9 F I don't care.
- 10 D I have to. I don't either. Uh, but, yeah, the room has been sanitized. I do have
- to ask, have you had any symptoms of...
- 12 F No.
- D ...COVID-19 in the last couple days? No?
- 14 F No.
- 15 D Have you been in contact with anybody?
- 16 F No (coughs).
- 17 D No? Just a tickle.
- 18 F No, it's, uh, smoke.
- D Oh, okay, well, I got a, a water bottle and granola bottle there for ya. Um, if you'd
- like, I can provide you with a, a face mask. Um, if, during this conversation, no,

I'm sure it's got something to do with, um, violating a 10 probation order for not taking down the website within 48 hours, but really it's not 11 about that 'cause if it was about that, you guys would've come and arrested me 12 three or four weeks ago. Um, I'm sure it's probably because there's been a 13 recent addition of some content that's very critical of Mark Myhre and exposes 14 some corruption that he was engaged in. 15 Tell me about it. D 16 F No. 17 18 D No? F It's on the website, but, uh... 19 Oh, it's on the website? D 20 F ...oh, yeah, everything's on the website. Even, even the newer stuff related to 21 the other cases... 22 Yeah. 23 D ...is on the website now, but can't say more about it. It's on the website F 24 (unintelligible). 25 D It's on the website? Only no, no, no. Uh, I'll be honest. I looked at the website 26 just the other day, and I didn't see any new postings or anything in the last 2.7 couple d-, where, where on the website is it? Just so I can... 28 F Under the R. v. Fox directory. 29 D ...yeah. 30 F Uh, 244069-5-BC. 31

Okay. My friend, you speak very quickly. Just wanna make sure I've got them.

- do with putting it on there. I'm simply stating it is there.

- 5 D Yeah.
- 6 F It's the usual, uh, URL.

Um, okay, so, again, we can jump into this D 8 more, but before we even get into that and everything else like that, I just wanna 9 make sure, do you need anything? Like I got you a water. I got you a, a, a 10 granola bar right there. 11 F Yeah, coffee and cigarettes. 12 D Uh, I can't do anything... 13 And... F 14 ...about that right now. - 5 F Yes. Well, wai-, wai-, no, no. I can't say that there's a reason I haven't taken it
- down. I can say that there is a reason it hasn't been taken down. Um...
- 7 D Okay.
- 8 F ...because it is exposing corruption and misconduct that goes on every day in the
- 9 local justice system.
- 10 D Yeah.
- F It exposes the corruption and misconduct of jackasses like Mark Myhre and Tony
- Lagemaat, and of course it exposes the misconduct of that evil horrible cunt of an
- ex-wife of mine. Oh, sorry. Maybe was a l-, bi-, a little bit too abrasive. Um, that
- horrible person of, uh, my ex-wife.
- D I'll tell ya right now. I spent four years walkin' the beat in the Downtown Eastside.
- 16 F Mm-hmm.
- 17 D There's virtually nothing that you could say to me that is...
- 18 F Oh, not for you. For the recording.
- 19 D ...going to offend me. Yeah. Well...
- 20 F This is going to be played in court. Um, obviously when the trial comes...

- 8 D Okay, and last thing, no promises or threats can be of any effect, right? S ...

- wanna make sure that you're, you're chattin' with me in this recorded and...
- 12 F Mm-hmm.
- D ...videoed room, uh, and that nobody has basically said you have to. That's not
- the case. Um, how long have you, you are, you're at Belkin House, right?
- 15 F Yeah.
- 16 D How long have you been there for, -ish?
- F I was released on August 20th, so from the 20th until now.
- D Okay. Is it goin' well there?
- 19 F Mm, I m-, define well. That's subjective. Um...
- 20 D Like is there no problems there?
- 21 F ...well, oh, yeah, no problems. No.
- 22 D Okay.
- 23 F I get along with everybody.
- 24 D Oh, that's good.
- 25 F Um, respectful to staff. Everybody likes me. There's no issues.
- 26 D That's good. That's actually challenging to do.
- 27 F Really?
- D Right? Well, there's some people who are, uh, cha-, hard to house...
- 29 F Mm, oh, sure.
- 30 D ...who have stayed in Belkin before.
- F Yeah, yeah.
- D And so you getting along, like you said, not you, personally, getting...

- 1 F Mm-hmm.
- 2 D ...along with, you know, staff and everything. That I actually believe. But you
- getting along with everybody else there, like there must some people there who
- 4 just don't like other people.
- 5 F Mm-hmm.
- 6 D So, uh, that's, that's good to know. But I am aware of their policy that they
- 7 usually, there's a time limit.
- 8 F 30 days.
- 9 D Yeah.
- 10 F But I've heard rumours. I haven't verified it with the staff...
- 11 D Yeah.
- F ...but, uh, I've heard rumours that because of COVID-19...
- 13 D Yeah.
- 14 F ...they've been extending people.
- 15 D Oh.
- F But anyway, if they don't extend me, then my 30 days runs out in two days, so...
- D Okay, and any...
- F ...your timing is impeccable.
- D ...any plans on goin' anywhere, or have you been lookin' anywhere else to stay?
- 20 F Yeah. North Fraser.
- 21 D Oh.
- 22 F I've been waiting for you guys to come and arrest me. I mean, I said to the
- judge, I'm not taking down the website.
- 24 D Yeah.
- 25 F An-, I'm kinda surprised it took this long.
- 26 D I just got to the section.
- F I think it's because if it were not for those recent, um, changes about Mark
- Myhre...
- 29 D Yeah.
- 30 F ...um, then probably nobody would've done anything, but I suspect that Mark
- Myhre probably threw a hissy fit because he's a little pansy bitch and went, oh,

- he's saying these mean things about me. Take this off. Get him in jail or 1 something. Sorry. I haven't had a coffee yet. 2 Preach (phonetic) I... D 3 F I'm not the most eloquent right now. 4 ...eh, I'm irritable without my second usually third... D 5 F Mm. 6 ...cup of coffee of the day. Um, s-, maybe you can give me some clarity 'cause 7 D like I said, I r-, reviewed a couple things on your website. 8 F Mm-hmm. 9 But what, what did Mark Myhre do to you? Like... D 10 F He was the prosecutor in the criminal harassment case. He knew they 11 (unintelligible) it's all on the website. D No, I know. Like I said, I've been through it... 13 Mm-hmm. F 14 ...right? But like specifically, there's a lot on there. D 15 F Yeah. 16 D Like let's be honest 17 18 F Yeah, yeah. Like I can't go through it in a day. I've had a day to prepare D 19 F Mm-hmm. 20 D Right? So, and to be honest, I was hopin' I could get it from you just 'cause I'm, 21 I'm surprised. 'Cause before this, you had no criminal h-, history. You had very 22 little interaction. 23 F Yes. 24 In the eyes of everyone... D 25 F Yes. 26 ...you are a normal upstanding citizen. 27 D F I was, yes, and... 28 And then shit happened, and here we are. D 29 F ...yes, because my fucking ex-wife... 30

F ...took my child, ran off to another fucking state with him.

- D Yeah. 1 F Tells a buncha lies to get me deported to a fucking country that I'm not a fucking 2 citizen of. 3 D Yeah. 4 Then I end up up here, and then you ja-, not you, but... F 5 D Thank you. 6 F ...your stupid fuckin' system up here pulls all this bullshit about lying and ignoring 7 all of her perjury and such. 8 Yeah. 9 D Finds me guilty and sends me to prison for three fucking years, and then I get F 10 out, and then they say, no, you can't leave British Columbia. You're not a 11 Canadian citizen. You can't work. You can't support yourself, but we're not gonna let you leave for three years I mean, what the fuck? 13 'Kay, I'm not gonna lie to you. That sounds fucked. D 14 F If the fucking bitch woulda just stayed out of our lives. She was gone for nine 15 fucking years. She didn't have to come back and... 16 Yeah. D 17 18 ...take my son and run off and go, oh, he's trying to take my child and take him to another country. You need to arrest him. 19 D Yeah. 20 F And then this jackass CBSA up here tells Homeland Security, oh, yeah, you can 21 deport him here. He's not a Canadian citizen, but fuck it. We'll, we're puppets of 22 you, so go ahead. Okay. That's it. That's the whole story. 23 So, you're an American citizen stuck in Canada. D 24 F Yes. 25 D But they're saying you're a Canadian citizen? 26 F No. It's... 27 They're not, you're not even a Canadian citizen, but... D 28 F (Unintelligible) 29

CBSA and IRCC documents, it...

1	F	clearly states they're on the website right there.
2	D	Yeah.
3	F	They were evidence at one my trials recently.
4	D	Yeah.
5	F	They clearly state that I was born in the United States.
6	D	Okay.
7	F	They acknowledge it. But now, because they fucked up so bad allowing
8		Homeland Security to deport me here
9	D	Yeah.
10	F	now they won't get involved.
11	D	No.
12	F	I say, well, remove me. I can't leave voluntarily, so please deport me. If I get
13		deported, then it's, it's okay. I'm not violating
14	D	Yeah.
15	F	probation.
16	D	Yeah.
17	F	But we're not gonna get involved.
18	D	Of course not.
19	F	So, I'm stuck here living in fuckin' homeless shelters until the end of 2021, and if
20		go back to the US
21	D	Yeah.
22	F	they're gonna issue a warrant here, and then Homeland Security's gonna
23		come and arrest me and send me back like they did the last two times.
24	D	Yeah.
25	F	So, that's why I'm a little bit pissed off, and that's why, um, I was a perfectly fine
26		upstanding citizen before.
27	D	Yeah.
28	F	And then everything falls apart after this
29	D	Yeah.
30	F	with the criminal harassment thing. In 2015 she files a complaint. The RCMP
31		investigates. I had a firearms licence, a PAL at the time.

32 D Okay.

- 1 F Now, if there was any credibility to her claims at all, they would've suspended my
- 2 PAL but they investigated for four months, and during that four-month stay, my
- PAL was in a restricted state where I just couldn't buy any new firearms, but they
- didn't suspend it. They didn't take away the firearms...
- 5 D (Unintelligible)
- 6 F ...that I had. They investigated. They determined that her, her claims were not
- 7 credible. There's nothing to worry about, and then they restored my PAL back to
- 8 normal.
- 9 D Okay.
- 10 F Then, a few months later, because I decided to move back to the US, then they
- decided to arrest me and ship me back here.
- 12 D Okay.
- 13 F So, it's starting to seem like there's a pattern here that, um, they freak out and
- get angry and arrest me when I go back to the US. Except this time. This time,
- it's because I made Mark Myhre look like a pansy bitch.
- D Now, is it just Mark Myhre that you're, and your ex-wife that you're pissed off
- 17 with, or...
- F Well, I've got a lot to say about Bernie Wolfe, as well, but that's (unintelligible).
- 19 D Bernie Wolfe.
- 20 F Oh, he's the prosecutor on the other one about the leaving BC.
- 21 D Yeah.
- 22 F I turned myself in to CBSA so...
- 23 D Yeah.
- 24 F ...that CBSA would deny me readmission. This is, w-, well, most of this is on the
- website.
- 26 D Yeah.
- 27 F It's incomplete.
- 28 D Okay
- 29 F So that, that way, I wouldn't be violating the probation conditions...
- 30 D Yeah.
- F ...because Mark Myhre even said at the sentencing that if I get removed or if I'm
- told to leave by IRCC or CBSA...

- 1 D Yeah.
- 2 F ...obviously he's not gonna prosecute me for that because then I'm not leaving
- 3 voluntarily.
- 4 D Of course.
- 5 F So, that's exactly what I did. I turned myself in at the Douglas border crossing.
- 6 D Yeah.
- 7 F CBSA tells me, oh, you're not admissible, but I don't think that the US is gonna
- 8 allow you in because you don't have proof of citizenship on you. I'm like, don't
- worry about that. I'll deal with that with CBSA, and then I confirmed that, okay,
- but I'm not admissible, right? If I try to go back in, you're gonna arrest me. She
- says, yes, you are absolutely not admissible to Canada. So, then I go back to
- the US. I knew CBP, CBP was gonna arrest me.
- 13 D Yeah.
- 14 F And so I was prepared for that.
- 15 D Mm-hmm.
- 16 F Um, but then the jackoff goes and gets a warrant up here, and then they send me
- back here for that. And then Bernie Wolfe was the prosecutor on that case.
- 18 D Yeah.
- 19 F Um, uh, CBSA destroys the video footage of me at the border. Then they lie and
- say that there's no evidence I ever presented myself, and then Bernie Wolfe is in
- court lying about that, too, saying, oh, Mr. Fox must be lying about presenting
- himself to CBSA on that day because there's absolutely no record that he did,
- and surely there would be some record. But then I get from IRCC a copy of my
- 24 GCMS, my Global Case Management System...
- 25 D Yeah.
- 26 F ...report, which shows the notes. It has the notes from the CBSA officer.
- They've been lying all this time to the court and everybody.
- 28 D Yeah
- 29 F So, I show that to the court, and the court says, okay, well, we're gonna proceed,
- and I want this CBSA officer to come and testify. And then of course she comes
- and testifies, but then she lies and she actually testifies that at a port of entry, the

- burden is on CBSA to prove that somebody's not a Canadian citizen, and if
- 2 CBSA can't prove that I'm not a Canadian citizen or somebody's not...
- 3 D Yeah.
- 4 F ...they have to allow the person into the country. I'm, what is wrong with you?
- 5 The law is the opposite on the matter. At a port of entry, the burden is on the
- 6 person seeking entry to Canada to prove that they're entitled to enter. Anyway,
- what a fuckin' fiasco. This whole fucking justice system up here, or at least in the
- 8 Vancouver area, is so fuckin' demented. Um...
- 9 D Try working within it.
- 10 F ...yeah, but you can leave. I can't. They won't let me.
- 11 D Uh, uh, well, I can't leave my job, otherwise, you know, I can't afford bills.
- F Well, you can resign. You can go work in a differen province or...
- 13 D Yeah.
- 14 F ...a different country or something.
- 15 D Yeah, no...
- 16 F Um...
- D ...it, it's, it's a hard system. There's, I'll, I'll be blunt. Li-, I've been doing it, this
- job for 11 years, and every, almost...
- 19 F ...mm hmm.
- 20 D ...almost every time I leave that courthouse, I'm d-, I'm just shakin' my head,
- right? Like it's just th-, it's backwards.
- 22 F All right. So, we've built a rapport.
- 23 D Yes, uh, honestly, no, like...
- 24 F So, now I put my gun down and now I'll tell you everything that you wanna know.
- 25 D ...no (unintelligible).
- 26 F I'm being sarcastic.
- D Obviously. You're, you and I have very similar sarcasm there, uh, but, no I'm, I'm
- dead serious. Like our court system...
- 29 F Mm-hmm.
- 30 D ...needs to be completely...
- F Yes, it's a joke.
- 32 D ...turned upside down.

- F And if you're a drug addict or something or you have drug problems, oh, well,
- then it's just a revolving door. Yeah. Go ahead. Go ahead. We'll let you go.
- 3 Go take more drugs.
- 4 D Oh, no, they don't even make the door.
- 5 F What?
- 6 D They don't even make the door. I can make i-, a hundred drug arrests in the
- 7 Downtown Eastside and the court system won't even accept the charges.
- 8 F Mm.
- 9 D Like, uh, no, no, no, no. Even dealers. I c-, I've arrested drug dealers.
- 10 F Mm-hmm.
- D And they've said, well, you know, it's not, it's not kilo level, so we...
- 12 F Right.
- D ...don't care. Say, oh, okay, this is the poison that's killing people down here, but
- no. No. I, i-, it's, anyway, that's a conversation for another day. Maybe over a
- 15 coffee. Um, but, yes, so, I'm just gonna summarize a little bit here.
- 16 F Mm.
- D Uh, and correct me if I'm wrong. You've been screwed by the system and you've
- been expecting to be arrested because the website hasn't been taken down yet.
- 19 F Screwed by the system. Um, okay, and, um, yeah, sure, fine.
- 20 D So, who has access to this website?
- 21 F Not gonna tell you.
- 22 D Li-, li-, y-, okay.
- 23 F I can tell you that...
- 24 D Yeah.
- 25 F ...people outside of Canada.
- 26 D People outside of...
- 27 F Uh, uh, oh, wait, wait. When you say have access to the website, you mean to
- the contents (unintelligible) publicly accessible.
- 29 D ...yes, like who can, who can post things to it?
- 30 F Or who has access to go in, to log in to, oh, okay.
- D Yeah, that's what I mean. Like who can, who can post...
- 32 F Yeah, no, I'm not, I'm not gonna answer that.

- 1 D ...(unintelligible) to this website. No?
- 2 F No.
- D Okay. Um, okay, you know I have to ask.
- 4 F Of course.
- 5 D Right? Um, but you were given the condition to take it down. So, it, can, is it
- safe to assume, like j-,...
- 7 F Let me ask you.
- 8 D ...yeah, oh, please.
- 9 F Do you have any evidence at all that the website was not taken down within 48
- hours and then put right back up by somebody else?
- 11 D Uh, my knowledge (unintelligible).
- 12 F I know the answer to that question. The quest-, the answer is no.
- 13 D Yeah. Okay. My answer is I don't know.
- 14 F Right.
- 15 D Right? Um, I think the fact that...
- 16 F Well, yeah. That's what I mean. You don't know.
- D ...like I said, the breach today is because it's still viewable.
- 18 F Mm-hmm
- D Right? It had to be taken down, right? I logged onto it just a day ago.
- 20 F Mm-hmm.
- D Right? So, it's still there and that's, that's the breach.
- 22 F I know. I saw the access logs.
- 23 D Yeah. Right?

- I assume the City of Vancouver was the VPD and I assume that the Province of
- 26 British Columbia is probably Crown Counsel.
- 27 D (Unintelligible) I'm not gonna argue.
- 28 F There was also, a couple weeks ago, a lot of activity from Shared Services
- 29 Canada, and I assume that that's the RCMP.
- 30 D From who?
- F Shared Services Canada. All the government, uh, they, they set up their internal
- network in this...

- D Yeah. 1
- F ...ass backward way or back assward (phonetic)? But, um... 2
- D Ass backward. 3
- F ...so that they have a proxy server set up in Ottawa and... 4
- D Yeah. 5
- F ...even though an RCMP office or, uh, federal offices out here, all the packets go 6
- through this proxy server in Ottawa. 7
- D Yeah. 8
- So, it shows up in the access logs as, uh, 198.212 or something. 9 F

- 17 D ...okay. It's a big company.
- F Yeah. I did, I sorry, I was going to make a comment about my opinion of the
- position there, but I don't want to speak poorly about a past employer or client...
