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- 1 JUDGE FOR THE RECORD
- 2 This is the Immigration Court at Eloy, Arizona, December
- 3 6th, 2007. Immigration Judge Sean H. Keenan presiding in a
- 4 continued removal proceeding.
- 5 JUDGE TO MR. RIESS
- 6 Q. Good morning, sir. What is your name?
- 7 A. Good morning. Richard Riess.
- 8 JUDGE TO MR. RIESS
- 9 Thank you.
- 10 JUDGE FOR THE RECORD
- 11 A 88 664 582. The respondent is present in court detained
- 12 by the Department of Homeland Security, appearing pro se. The
- Government is represented by Assistant Chief Counsel Jennifer
- 14 Gaz.
- 15 JUDGE TO MR. RIESS
- Q. Do you have an attorney, sir?
- A. No, I don't, sir.
- Q. Do you want more time to get an attorney or do you
- want your case started today?
- 20 A. I'll start today, thank you.
- 21 Q. Do you waive and give up your right to an attorney for
- 22 today's hearing?
- 23 A. Yes.
- Q. Do you have further documents on your United States
- 25 citizenship claim, sir?

- 1 A. No, sir.
- Q. Well, you said that your mother was born in the United
- 3 States and you were born in California, correct?
- 4 A. Yes.
- 5 Q. All right. And do you want more time to try to
- 6 establish that?
- 7 A. No, sir.
- 8 Q. Do you still believe you were born in the United
- 9 States?
- 10 A. Yes.
- 11 JUDGE TO MS. GAZ
- 12 Does the Government have any further documents or
- information on that?
- MS. GAZ TO JUDGE
- Your Honor, we've attempted to obtain his birth
- 16 certificate. However, we have been unable to. There is some
- indication by the respondent to his officer that we were looking
- under the wrong name, that he changed his name at some point, so
- we're still investigating further.
- 20 JUDGE TO MR. RIESS
- 21 The Government is still investigating trying to assist you,
- trying to get with the town you say you were born in to try to
- get your birth certificate, and I'll postpone your case for that
- 24 effort to continue. Do you want that?
- 25 MS. GAZ TO JUDGE

- 1 Your Honor, just, just for the record --
- 2 JUDGE TO MS. GAZ
- 3 Yes.
- 4 MS. GAZ TO JUDGE
- 5 -- too, respondent has been uncooperative in assisting the
- 6 Government in obtaining his birth certificate.
- 7 JUDGE TO MR. RIESS
- Q. All right, sir, do you want your case postponed?
- 9 A. What would be the alternative?
- 10 Q. The alternative would be to go forward today, and
- 11 based on the testimony or the evidence I have before me, I would
- not be able to find that you're a United States citizen. I
- would not be able to find that you have submitted substantial
- credible evidence, and so I would have to find perhaps you're a
- 15 native and citizen of Canada.
- 16 A. Okay.
- 17 Q. Well, do you want your case postponed to continue to
- 18 pursue your United States citizenship claim or do you want your
- 19 case started today?
- 20 A. I'll start the case today.
- 21 Q. All right. Is it true you're a native and citizen of
- 22 Canada?
- 23 A. No.
- JUDGE TO MS. GAZ
- Does the Government have documents, the I-213 or anything

- 1 else?
- 2 MS. GAZ TO JUDGE
- 3 Your Honor, I apologize: I don't have copies of it.
- 4 JUDGE TO MR. RIESS
- 5 Q. Is it true you were admitted to the United States at
- 6 Blaine, Washington, January 1st, 1997, as a nonimmigrant visitor
- 7 authorized to remain until July 1st, 1997?
- 8 A. No.
- 9 Q. All right, you deny you remained beyond the authorized
- 10 time, correct?
- 11 A. Yes.
- 12 Q. All right, your case has to be postponed for the
- Government to introduce documents as to the allegations, and
- also perhaps they can continue to assist you. You understand?
- 15 A. Yes.
- 16 Q. All right. Is that all right with you?
- 17 A. Well, I would prefer to just address it today and get
- 18 it over with.
- 19 Q. Well, you denied everything, so I can't order you
- removed and deported. You're claiming you're a citizen. You've
- 21 denied all the allegations. The Government is not prepared.
- They don't have documents. So I have nothing before me except
- denials. So your case has to be postponed for, I believe, the
- 24 Government to submit their documents. Any questions on that?
- 25 A. Is it possible to get a bond or --

1	Q. We'll schedule you for a bond, and that will be within
2	three days. That will be Monday. Fill out the bond worksheet,
3	please. That will assist you and the Court. Try to get any
4	documents you want
5	A. Sure.
6	Q and your bond will be Monday, ten o'clock,
7	December 10th, and we'll talk about the bond, and this case will
8	be February 6th, '08, 2:00 to 4:30, for the contested issues of
9	removability and United States citizenship, individual hearing.
10	Any questions, sir?
11	A. No, sir.
12	JUDGE TO MR. RIESS
13	Thank you. Case adjourned.
14	HEARING CONTINUED
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
